LIFE is very simple at home in Kajo Keji, Sudan, with no electricity, no running water, no plumbing, no fridge, no stove, no phone, no TV, no computer, no local hospital, no advertising, no supermarket, no DIY store, no shopping mall, no traffic jams.

CHRISTMAS is very simple in Kajo Keji with no cards, no tree, no wish list, no decorations, no lights, no office party, no gift exchange, no revelers, no last minute shopping, no pageant, no carolers, no midnight service, no turkey, ham or roast with all the trimmings...well, yes, a family dinner with traditional Sudanese foods, and a community gathered to celebrate the birth of Christ.

**Solar Lantern**  
 Simply set in the sun to recharge. Provide light for reading and study. Great for teachers and clergy.



**Water Jug**  
 Sometimes called a Jerry Can. Holds five gallons of water for transport. Highly coveted for carrying that most precious resource.

**Wind-up Radio**  
 News and information is hard to come by without some sort of receiver. This requires no electricity, just keep turning the crank.



**Bicycle**  
 The favorite mode of personal transport, when traveling many miles in diverse areas. Add a basket and you can carry a multitude of stuff.



**Fabric**  
 Yards and yards -- to make school uniforms for all the school children highly sought after fabric will also give those at the sewing center resources they need to learn basic sewing and clothing making.



**Laying Hen**  
 Full-grown hens will produce their own reward, especially when there are lots of them -- eggs



galore -- a great nutritional boost. Add a rooster to the clutch and keep production going.

**Sewing Machine**  
 To be used in the sewing center, for learning to construct clothing as well as making school uniforms.



**Sturdy Table**  
 Indispensable for the sewing center, schoolrooms, laying out projects, reading, artwork. Everyone appreciates a workspace.



**Soccer Ball**  
 Great exercise and fun with or without the marked field and



goals. Great team building sport for adults as well as kids.

**Jump Rope**  
 Exercise that keeps on going for the individual as well as groups. Great fun for all ages.



**Plastic Chair**  
 A highly prized item wherever people gather. Sewing center, church, school, indoors and out. So many people, so few places to sit.



**Basketball**  
 All that's needed is a hoop. Eager teens will improvise and find a spot to attach a circle to a pole, tree or side of a building. Fun for kids and grown-ups.
