

This service is our opportunity for congregations in Nazareth to share in a celebration of the Annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. There will be a service of Holy Communion at St. Brigid's at 9:00 AM. Further information about our Annual Meeting and this Ecumenical Service will be forthcoming.

And on Sunday January 13th the day the church celebrates the Baptism of Jesus and one of the special days in the church year set aside for baptisms during our service I will have the pleasure of baptizing our grandson Nicholas, and welcoming him into the whole Christian family.




Epiphany Dinner Invitation

Annual Church Meeting Information

Here is information that everyone needs to know about the 2008 Annual Church Meeting.

At our annual meeting we will receive the various committee reports, elect members to our Vestry and consider an amendment to our by-laws to increase the size of the Vestry to 9 lay members.

First, annual reports from all organizations and committees are due in the church office on Monday, January 7.

Second, at our November Vestry meeting a motion to increase the size of the Vestry from 7 to 9 members was approved. The purpose of this proposal is to increase the parish representation on the Vestry and to provide additional leadership for parish activities. The members of the Vestry

believe the continuing growth of our parish and the expansion of a number of our programs support the need for additions to the Vestry. Jack Jones, Brian Farley, and Lori Dobson were appointed as the nominating committee at the November Vestry meeting. Persons wishing to be considered for the Vestry please speak to one of them

Third, St. Brigid's will participate in the Nazareth Area Ministerium's Ecu-

menical Service on Sunday morning, January 20th.
Details of this will be announced later, but it does mean a change in our normal annual meeting date.
We will be holding the meeting at a parish dinner at 5:30 p.m. on Saturday evening January 19th. A sign-up sheet is available in the parish hall.

Senior Youth Group News



The Episcopal Diocese of Bethlehem

"To Live and Share Christ's Love"



St. Brigid's was founded in 1995 as a congregation in the Episcopal Diocese of Bethlehem and was accepted as a mission of the diocese at its 1996 Convention.

The name, "St. Brigid" was chosen in honor of our diocesan partnership with the Dioceses of Meath and Kildare in Ireland.

The congregation initially met in the basement community room of the Nazareth National Bank. On August 2, 1998 St. Brigid's held its first service in its newly acquired church building at 310 Madison Avenue in Nazareth, Pennsylvania.

The Rev. Canon Jane Teter, a member of the Bishop's staff, was our first vicar. The Rev. Judith Snyder served as the church's second vicar; and in 2004 she was succeeded by the Very Rev. Robert D. Schenkel, Jr., the current priest-in-charge.
