## SENIOR WARDEN'S ANNUAL PARISH MEETING REPORT

Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares. Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them; and those who are ill-treated.... Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Hebrews 13:1-3, 16

**T**he Lord has blessed us in the past year, so once again it is only fitting to begin this report by thanking many who have contributed to the life of this parish. Although they are not here, I thank Bishop Paul, Archdeacon Stringfellow and Canon Lewellis, without whom we could not have provided many of our services this year. Without the committee chairs and members, this parish could not function. So once again I would like to recognize committee chairs by name. Please stand when your name is called, so other parishioners know who you are. Please hold all applause until we finish the introductions.

Thanks to Fr. Reiss and Bishop Paul and his staff, we restarted the weekly healing service beginning the first Tuesday in Lent. We also celebrated some Saint's days. We have not been able to provide the monthly Requiem service, however. Nevertheless, we celebrated the Holy Eucharist (154) times, with (100) of those celebrations taking place on Saturday evenings or Sunday mornings. There were four (4) recorded private communions given to the sick and shut in. Lay members made many additional visits to the sick and shut in that are not recorded in the books. 6,188 children of God entered the doors to worship here on Sunday mornings and at least another 1,425 were ministered to through mid-week celebrations of the Holy Eucharist or other services. The Daily Office was recited 217 times this past year, 59 times on Sundays and 158 times during the week. There was one (1) marriage, there were five (5) baptisms, and six (6) people were confirmed. Six (6) of our parishioners passed away, three (3) of them had funeral masses here at St. Stephen's.

Six (6) people asked to be taken off the books, one (1) transferred out. Four (4) members transferred in and one (1) joined after confirmation. This left us with a decrease in membership of eight (8).

As Christians, it is our obligation to read and study scripture and to live our lives as scriptures teach us. Now and again, it helps to look in the mirror and see how we are meeting that obligation. I have used the passage from Hebrews for this inspection.

Brotherly Love: The scripture from Hebrews admonishes to “Let brotherly love continue.” How do we show our brotherly love for one another? We show this love in how we help each other and spend our time together. How have we, the St. Stephen’s family done this? Let us count the ways.

1. All of us have pulled together in a variety of ways to assist Fr. John in ministering to our congregation. We have been blessed this year with wonderful lay leadership. Marty Brynildsen and Charlie Robinson have continued to serve us faithfully as Lay Worship Leaders and as Chalice Bearers. During Lent, we borrowed Charles Johns from his parish to assist us with Evening Prayer. After training this summer, Ken Rider has begun leading Evening Prayer. As you all know, Bishop Paul has licensed Michael Metro to serve us in a variety of lay capacities during his testing and training for the Episcopal priesthood. Marty, Charlie, Ken and Michael—thank you for all you do as leaders in this parish.

2. I know several of you have been very faithful about visiting the sick and shut in of our congregation. Unfortunately, some of us who have visited, me included, have not kept records of our visits as we should have. Therefore, it is still difficult to estimate the number of lay visits to sick and shut in this year. In 2008, let us all try to be more diligent about keeping records of our visits and reporting them to Denise Robinson, who heads our Promotion and Evangelism Committee.

In March 2007, members of the Order of St. Luke held a Healing Mission here at St. Stephen’s. Fr. Peter Ostrander guided us in our studies and worship together and provided laying on of hands after our Sunday services.

Our group continues to meet and is exploring the possibility of another healing mission.

3. Maurice has recruited new choir members. I hope you all had an opportunity to enjoy the beautiful music they have made throughout the year. I also hope all of you read Joe Lamm's wonderful piece in the December 2007 SteveAdore. Sometimes we are amazed at how the Holy Spirit works in our lives. Maurice and choir members, I don't think you will ever know how much you have blessed all of us with your ministry.

4. To those of you who have volunteered to be lay readers at Sunday masses, to the Altar Guild and Jr. Altar Guild members, to the Acolytes and to the Ushers—thank you for your service.

5. We also have wonderful Youth leaders. Many of you volunteered to teach Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. Teaching our youth is an important priority, and I thank all of you for your time and service.

6. Our Stewardship Committee was hard at work this year. They provided several opportunities for us to spend time together and hear lessons about stewardship.

7. Some have generously given of your time to the upkeep of the church building and the grounds. It was quite a busy year for outside maintenance.

8. Some of us have volunteered to help with our newly formed Cub Scout troop. We will host Scouting Sunday here on February 3, during Bishop Paul's visit. After the service, you are all invited to stay for the "Blue and Gold Banquet." I am passing around a sign up sheet for anyone who is or was at one time a scout. Please sign it so that you can be recognized at the banquet. Feel free to attend the banquet in your uniform.

9. Many of you volunteered your time at home or here at church to assist with the Craft Show. Those of you who worked here at church know that we enjoyed a great deal of fellowship while we worked. You will hear a

full report about the Craft Show later, but I want to thank each and every one of you who helped in any way. Your participation was vital to the success of the show.

Your generosity with precious time is important as we look forward to calling a new rector. Remember that we cannot expect him to do everything. We must be willing to work with him as active team members. Please pray about the ways you might show your brotherly love in 2008.

Hospitality, doing good, sacrificing, and sharing what we have:  
The author of the book of Hebrews instructed the church to be hospitable, to do good, to make sacrifices, and to share what they had. We at St. Stephen's have done that in a number of ways this past year. I am hopeful that we will explore new ways to follow this biblical advice in the coming year.

**Making Sacrifices:** Let us look at the financial sacrifices we have made in comparison with last year. For 2007, 67 families or individuals pledged. Pledged income for that year was \$117,500. This represented a 26% decrease in pledged income from the year before. Thus far for 2008, 54 families or individuals have pledged. Thankfully, for 2008, those who pledged have increased their pledges. Our pledged income for 2008 is \$120,000 an INCREASE of \$2,500, or 2%. I must point out that for the year 2006, there was a \$90,000 decrease from 2005 pledged income. Therefore, although our increase was small for 2008, I consider it a significant improvement. I thank all of you for your commitment to our church and our mission together. I hope that a candidate looking at our parish recognizes that we are all committed to provide financially for his service with us.

In addition to pledged income, we have a fund drive for a major property improvement—the lighting in the sanctuary. Thanks to all of you who have donated to this project. Another project I doubt you have heard about is conversion of an existing restroom to one that is truly accessible to folks who must use a wheelchair or a walker. In the past year, I have heard several parishioners or family of parishioners state that they cannot stay for church functions because of the lack of appropriate bathroom facilities. That situation needs to be corrected. Several parishioners

have generously provided for this project, and I thank them.

Hospitality, doing good, and sharing with those in need: We've talked about the sacrifices we have made. What becomes of the money we pledge? Obviously, funds are needed for the day to day running of the church. However, St. Stephen's is determined that we will share what we have and be hospitable to those in need. We have again tithed 10% of the parish income to a variety of missions. In 2007, we spent \$21,000 on the following:

A. Christian Education

- Monthly financial assistance to Doug Moyer, our seminarian at Nashotah House
- Tuition assistance for a student at our Day School Financial assistance for one of our parish children to attend Christian School

B. International Missions

- Peace Hill Old Age Home, Kerala, India for building a chapel area, and purchasing carpeting and chairs
- The Diocesan Mission in Kajo Keji, Sudan

C. Missions within the US

- Donation to Bishop Parsons
- Donation to Katie Siegmund's summer mission project
- Forward in Faith

D. Local Missions

- Lehigh County Council of Churches
- New Bethany Ministries
- Fr. John's discretionary fund

In addition to monetary donations, five members spent three days putting a fresh coat of paint on the walls at New Bethany Ministries. Beginning in July, many of you have so generously given of your time every Monday evening at our Food Bank. Many of you helped purchase, sort, and wrap gifts for children whose families receive food. Some have donated hats, scarves and mittens to be given to those in need this winter.

Several very big hearted men of our parish, responding to a last minute request, moved an elderly woman who had no one else to help her. In all these ways you have entertained angels unawares.

Looking forward into 2008, I have approached three young people to invite them to attend St. Michael's Conference in Connecticut. Later this month, I expect to receive brochures about the conference, which will be held in August. If any of our youth attend, I am optimistic that our vestry will pledge to support them financially in this opportunity to grow in their spiritual lives. I am hopeful that a small group of parishioners can again participate at least a local and perhaps a national mission project this year. Please pray about your own participation in this type of ministry. If you have any suggestions, please let me know and we will make every effort to fulfill that mission.

On the subject of hospitality: Each Sunday, we have an opportunity to be hospitable to one another and to visitors who come through our doors. Attendance at services is important for our own spiritual well being and for all of us as a family. So how was our attendance in 2007 as compared to the year before? Attendance at Sunday services was slightly less this year than it was last year. However, some folks are attending Tuesday healing mass instead of or in addition to Sunday services. Our Sunday total attendance dropped by 600. Stated another way, our average Sunday attendance dropped from 130 to 119. This is an 8.5% decrease. Please make an effort to faithfully attend worship services in 2008.

Each Sunday and sometimes during the week, this parish hall is used for social gatherings. In the past, this congregation served dinners from this kitchen on a regular basis. Although the dinners were fundraisers, many of our neighbors enjoyed the social interaction they provided. Some have asked about serving dinners again. This is something we could consider. However, our Property committee is looking into some major repairs for the kitchen, including new gas ovens. The counter tops are in need of replacement as well. Repairing the kitchen would help make this space better for all social gatherings held here. Whether we resume serving dinners in 2008 may depend upon the timing of kitchen construction.

Do not become discouraged about not having a full time Rector. Your Search Committee is looking very carefully at each candidate. We want a rector who will work well with our youth and who will evangelize in our community. It is important during this time of waiting that we pray. Please continue to pray for the Search Committee and for our new rector in your own personal daily prayers.

Please come out any Tuesday through Friday for Evening Prayer. If you are available on Tuesday mornings at 9:30, please attend the Healing Mass. God does answer our prayers and He will provide for us in his time and in his way. In the meantime, please continue to invite your family, friends and neighbors and give warm greetings to visitors to our parish. Please attend the Saturday evening social events sponsored by the Stewardship Committee. In this way, you will show hospitality to each other and to visitors who come through our doors.

I thank you for your prayers and support during the past year.

Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in you that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen. Hebrews 13: 20-21

## Shrove Tuesday / Pancake Day

February 5<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m.

Are you giving up anything for Lent?

Do you know what other people are giving up?

Do you know why?

### Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day)

Shrove Tuesday is the last day before the period which Christians call Lent. This day is one of the moveable feasts in the church calendar and is directly related to the date on which Easter falls. Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, so the date varies from year to year and falls between February 3 and March 9.

### Where does the word Shrove come from?

The name Shrove comes from the old word "shrive" which means to confess. On Shrove Tuesday, in the Middle Ages, people used to confess their sins so that they were forgiven before the season of Lent began.

### Shrove Tuesday a time for celebrations

Shrove Tuesday is a day of celebration as well as penitence, because it's the last day before Lent. Lent is a time of abstinence, of giving things up. So Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent. Pancakes are eaten on this day because they contain fat, butter and eggs which were forbidden during Lent. More locally and of German tradition, we love Fastnachts, or potato, squared off treats. They are so unlike donuts found in our local bakeries. Many people bake their own traditional delights. Trexlertown fire company makes thousands of these treats, and they are the real thing.

This all is leading up to Shrove Tuesday here at St. Stephens. A time of fellowship, eating and fun. Reserve this night for prayer service, good eating and fun, between 5:00 to 7:00pm. There is no charge for the meal, donations will be appreciated. Please use the sign up sheet on the bulletin boards in the corridor closest to the office and the kitchen. This will give our committee a better idea of how many to prepare for.
