

The Campbell Lectures honor the life of Robert K. Campbell



Robert K. Campbell, former Chief Executive Officer of the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company (PPL), was not only a leader in the corporate world, but also a highly regarded community leader, humanitarian, and a person whose actions emanated from his faith.

Ecumenical personally and professionally, Mr. Campbell worked to draw religious communities together to assist people in need in our community. It was this passion which lead Bob to spearhead the formation of Alliance Hall which houses five community organizations dedicated to assisting people in need including the LCCC.

In memory of Bob Campbell, the Committee on Ecumenism of the Lehigh County Conference of Churches has established these annual lectures to focus specifically on Christian unity.

The Rev. Dr. Ian T. Douglas is a passionate educator and activist for the worldwide mission of God. A recognized leader in The Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion, Professor Douglas is a member of the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church, member of the Design Group for the 2008 Lambeth Conference, and member-elect of the Anglican Consultative Council as a priest representing The Episcopal Church.



The Sunday Telegraph, London, named Douglas #30 on the Lambeth Power List, a countdown of the most influential figures around the Anglican Communion.

His most recent book is *Understanding the Windsor Report: Two Leaders in the American Church Speak Across the Divide*, with Paul Zahl (Church Publishing).

Dedicated to helping The Episcopal Church live faithfully into God's mission through the Millennium Development Goals, Professor Douglas is co-founder and vice chair of the Board of Episcopalians for Global Reconciliation. Sought after widely as a speaker and mission organizer, Professor Douglas has been quoted in almost every major syndicated newspaper in the United States.
