COMMUNITY LIFE STANDARDS FOR YOUTH

ATTENDING DIOCESAN YOUTH EVENTS

1. Use of illegal drugs, tobacco products, and alcohol is not allowed during the event.
2. There will be a set curfew at the events. Participants are expected to abide by curfew times and rules as defined at the event. *Except in the case of emergency, youth participants must remain in designated sleeping areas from lights out until the time of the first scheduled event the next morning.*
3. Everyone is expected to attend the entire event and participate in all scheduled activities.
4. Visitors are not allowed during youth events. A visitor is defined as a person who is unexpected, not registered, and/or does not contribute to the conference.
5. No one may leave the site of the event without the permission of the adult in charge of the event.
6. Youth may not drive participants (other youth) during youth events. All drivers during youth events must be on the program team and must be 25 years of age or older.
7. The diocese does not provide transportation to and from youth events unless otherwise stated for a specific event. All transportation arrangements are to be made with parental permission. Youth planning to travel away from an event with a youth driver, other than who they arrived with, need to have written permission from their parent(s).
8. According to diocesan guidelines, one youth and one adult who are unrelated may not ride alone together in the car to or from diocesan events.
9. Visiting in defined sleeping areas by members of the opposite sex is prohibited. All meetings of friends of the opposite sex will occur in designated community areas.
10. Public displays of affection that are a distraction from participation in the event are not allowed.
11. Offensive language and inappropriate conversation is prohibited.
12. Weapons of any kind and potentially dangerous items (i.e. lighters, matches, pockets knives) are prohibited. Anyone found to possess these items will be sent home immediately.

Two warnings (yellow cards) will be given for breaking the rules about:

CURFEW PUBLIC DISPLAYS OF AFFECTION PARTICIPATION IN THE EVENT LANGUAGE

A young person will be sent home (red card) immediately for breaking the rules below:

ILLEGAL USE OF DRUGS, ALCOHOL OR TOBACCO PRODUCTS, LEAVING THE CONFERENCE SITE
BEING IN THE SAME BEDROOM OR DEFINED SLEEPING AREA OF A MEMBER OF THE OPPOSITE SEX,
LEAVING THE SITE OF THE EVENT WITHOUT PERMISSION, BULLYING BEHAVIOR, DANGEROUS BEHAVIOR

According to the rules listed above, the adult in charge of the event will make all decisions concerning sending anyone home. If a youth is to be sent home, it will be the responsibility of his/her parents or an adult designated by a parent to come to New York City to pick up the youth immediately. In the event that a youth is sent home from a diocesan event, participation in future diocesan events may not be allowed.

I hereby agree to abide by all rules of this event. I fully understand the consequences if a rule is broken.
